Case studies will be used to contextualise how climate, geology, and human activity work in combination with geomorphic processes to shape two landscapes in the UK. We study the Holderness coastline and the River Wye. Case studies are used to investigate the growth and/or decline of the Salford Quays and to examine the character of Leeds as a city, including the ways of life of the people who live in it. Theme 1: UK Environmental Challenges  Students will look at extreme weather events in the UK, in particular the links between extreme weather conditions and flooding. Students will develop an understanding of the factors affecting the UK's energy use and security, the decision makers involved, as well as sustainability and management. Students need to understand the causes and consequences of growth in Ethiopia particularly related to the process of rapid urbanisation.	Students continue their studies on People of the Planet. They will investigate a city (Istanbul) in a developed country by examining its people and culture and considering the influence they have on shaping the cities distinct ways of life and challenges.	Students deepen their understanding the key environmental threats affecting countries and the world. They will explore the changing climate, including possible causes, and the current consequences, the global circulation of the atmosphere which leads to a study of extreme weather conditions and subsequent drought in places such as California, Australia, and Ethiopia.
